St. Louis Grignion de Montfort was born on 31st January 1673 in a small town 'MONTFORT' in France. Even from his childhood days, he was virtuous and exhibited an extraordinary love for the poor. He loved and admired the mother of Jesus. He became a priest and worked ceaselessly for God and man. He went about from place to place with the message of God's love. He taught and served the poor people and championed their cause.

He was a great scholar, a powerful speaker and an author of many spiritual works, such as "The Love Of Eternal Wisdom", "The True Devotion To Mary", "The Secret Of Mary" and "The Secret Of the Rosary". His capacity to paint and carve, along with his poetic skills, has made him a spiritual "Leonardo da Vinci".

He never bothered about the consequences of telling the truth and doing what was right before the eyes of God. He was victimized by the world for his honesty and conviction.

He died at an early age of 43 on April 28th 1716. He was acclaimed a Saint by the people and the church authorities. He established many dedicated groups of men and women to carry on his good work, particularly instructing the youth. One such organization is the Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel Montfort school, Anakkara and many such educational institutions all over India and abroad are administered by the followers of St. Montfort, under the banner of 'Brothers of St. Gabriel'.

History of Montfort School, Anakkara

Montfort School, Anakkara has the distinction of being the first Montfortian School in Kerala. Montfort Brothers have been working in India for over 100 Years. A good number of these Brothers hail from Kerala. Yet they did not deem it necessary to start any educational institution in Kerala because there were already many priests and religious persons engaged in the educational field.

After the division of the Southern Province of the Montfort Brothers in 1993, the Brothers of the Yercaud Province were eagerly looking for a place in the High Range of Kerala to establish a good English Medium School.

Rev. Fr. Mathew Nellary, who was the Director of Malanadu Development Society based at Anakkara in Idukki District had a great desire to see a good school at Anakkara. So he wrote to various religious congregations suggesting them to start a school at that place.

He wrote a letter on 1st October 1993 to Bro. Antony Francisco who was the director of Montfort School, Yercaud. Since a positive reply came from Yercaud, Rev. Fr. Mathew Nellary went to Yercaud to meet the concerned people and to discuss matters about starting of a school. Thus it was decided to look for a suitable place for the school in the Anakkara Parish. Fr. George Kottady, who was the then Parish Priest of Anakkara Forane Church was very happy about the prospect and promised all the help for the commencement of the school.

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MONTFORT SCHOOL ANAKKARA

Rules and Regulations

ADMISSION

- a. The right age for admission in Pre-KG is three plus, LKG is four plus and for admission to class I is six plus.
- b. Normally admissions are given only in Nursery. Admission to other classes will be given, only if, there is a vacancy.
- c. All admissions shall be preceded by an interview and entrance test. The result will be notified from the office. The decision taken by the school authority in this regard is final.
- d. The application form should be filled in with great care and submitted to the office within the prescribed time.
- e. Admissions are open to all children without discrimination of caste, creed or language.

WITHDRAWAL

Students are admitted on the understanding that they would remain in the school at least for the entire academic year.

- a. The school year is divided into the following terms:
 1. June to October
 2. November to March
- b. If a parent desires to withdraw the child from the school before the end of the school year, the rules demand that the school fees for the entire term should be paid before the Transfer Certificate could be issued.
- c. An application for the Transfer Certificate should be made in writing by the parent or local guardian.
- d. The management reserves the right to compel the parents to withdraw their children if their conduct is harmful to other students.

DISMISSAL

- a. Irregular attendance, non-payment of fees, habitual disobedience and conduct which is injurious to the morale tone of the school, justify dismissal of a student at any time of the year.
- b. Malpractice in examinations is a grave offence. If found guilty the following rules shall apply. For the first time the student shall be awarded zero marks for all the papers of the said examination. If repeated it shall lead to suspension or dismissal

- c. Any misbehaviour of a serious nature that has become public knowledge is liable to bring about suspension or dismissal even if it took place outside the school premises.
- d. Any student failing twice in the same class will not be allowed to continue in the school

UNIFORM

(I) Uniform for Boys

- a. The boys shall come in neat and full school uniform, on all working days.
- b. On Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and on all working Saturdays the uniform is blue striped shirt (half sleeves), Oxford blue shorts/pants, blue socks, black shoes, school tie and belt.
- c. On Tuesdays and other stipulated days the uniform for classes I - VII will be track suit and House T-Shirt, white socks and white canvas shoes. For Classes VIII - XII, the uniform will be white pants, House T-Shirt, white socks and white canvas shoes.
- d. On Thursdays the uniform will be white shirt (half sleeves), white shorts/pants, white socks, white canvas shoes, school tie and belt for all.
- e. Boys up to class IV will wear short pants and others shall use long pants. On working Saturdays, they shall wear their school uniform.
- f. Boys are forbidden to wear pencil fit /skin fit / low waist pants.
- g. Boys will have their hair trimmed properly.

(II) Uniform for Girls

- a. The girls shall come in neat and full school uniform, on all working days.
- b. On Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and all working Saturdays the uniform for Girls up to X is oxford blue pinafore with blue striped shirt (half sleeve), black shoes, blue socks, school tie and belt
- c. For Std XI and XII the uniform on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and all working Saturdays is oxford blue salwar and blue striped kameez, oxford blue coat, black shoes and blue socks.
- d. On Tuesdays and other stipulated days the uniform for classes I - VII will be track suit and House T-Shirt with white socks and white canvas shoes. Classes VIII to X will have white skirt, house T-shirt, white socks and white canvas shoes

- e. For XI and XII girls the uniform on Tuesdays and Thursdays will be white salwar and kameez and oxford blue coat, white shoes and white socks.
- f. On Thursdays classes I - X will have white skirt, white shirt, white socks, white canvas shoes, school tie and belt.

(III) Uniform for Preparatory School Boys

- c. On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays - oxford blue and white striped shirts (half sleeves), oxford blue shorts, blue socks and black shoes.
- d. On Tuesdays and Thursdays - brown shorts, brown and white striped shirts, white socks and white shoes.

(III) Uniform for Preparatory School Girls

- a. On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, oxford blue frock, blue socks and black shoes.
- b. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, brown and white striped frock, white socks and white shoes.

- Pre-KG, LKG and UKG students should have handkerchiefs pinned to their pinafore.
- Students are forbidden to use costly ornaments.
- Students are permitted to wear only navy blue sweaters with the school emblem.

TRANSPORT FACILITIES

For the comfort and convenience of children who come far from the school, the school has eleven transport vehicles. These vehicles are made available for the students of Kattappana, Kumily, Vandiperiyar, Anavilasam and Cumbummettu.

BOYS' BOARDING

Montfort Boarding is a residence for boy students of Montfort School, Anakkara. It was started in the year 2000. This boarding aims at providing a homely atmosphere where a happy, friendly and spiritual relationship is fostered and maintained. The boarding life here helps the child to imbibe all the spiritual and moral virtues.

Admission

1. Application for admission to the hostel can be collected from the school office.
2. Only Montfort School students are admitted to Montfort hostel. Dismissal or withdrawal from the school automatically affects the place in the hostel and vice versa.

3. The warden will be in charge of the management and the day to day administration of the hostel.
4. In matters of admission, accommodation and disciplinary action, the principal's ruling shall be final.

Discipline

5. Every boarder shall maintain the highest moral standards of life at all places. Rules of modesty and decorum in dress must be strictly adhered to.
6. All cases of illness must be immediately reported to the warden. In case of serious illness the parent/guardian must take charge of their ward.
7. An inmate who wishes to vacate the hostel must give a written notice two weeks in advance, signed by their parent / guardian and total fees due for the term will have to be paid.

Visitors and Phone Calls

8. Relatives and friends of students are not allowed to visit them during school hours.
9. Parents are requested not to disturb the regular rhythm of boarding by their frequent visits and phone calls.
10. If there is an urgent need to meet your children, you may do so only on 2nd & 4th Sundays of the month between 1.00 p.m and 4.00 p.m. Whenever such visits are to be made, you are expected to get prior permission from the warden.
11. Hostel students are permitted to take leave only for the family programme related to their father, mother, sisters, brothers and grand parents.
12. Telephone calls can be received from 2.00 p.m. to 3.30 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays only.
13. On second Saturdays and Terminal Holidays, hostel students are permitted to be taken home by their parents or guardians with the permission of the warden.
14. Those students who go home for holidays are to be back by the eve of the next working day, before 5 p.m.
15. Montfort being an English medium school, the students are expected to use English as the medium of communication within the campus.
16. Every student is expected to maintain the high tone and reputation of the hostel by excelling out in the conduct, good manners and cleanliness both in and out of the campus.



17. No one is allowed to leave the campus without prior permission from the warden.
18. Students are not allowed to bring valuables, such as gold ornaments, cameras, tape recorders, mobile phones, costly watches etc. Students are responsible for the safe custody of their personal belongings.
19. Every student is expected to take part in all the co-curricular activities as part of their civic, cultural and leadership training.
20. Boarders should keep good discipline regarding rule of language, silence especially in the dormitory, study halls, bath rooms etc.
21. Boarders should not exchange articles or money with other students and no personal food item is allowed in the hostel. All money is to be deposited with the warden.
22. Books, magazines, periodicals or CD's not approved by the warden are strictly prohibited.
23. The use of tobacco, drugs, intoxicants, etc. are strictly forbidden and violation of this will result in immediate dismissal.
24. Wanton damage to school property, disfiguring of walls, indecent language or behaviour are punishable offences.
25. After night prayer, silence is to be maintained until next day's breakfast.
26. Silence is to be maintained in the dining hall until the prayer before meal is over.
27. Use of private electric/electronic appliances is forbidden.
28. Good conduct from all students both inside and outside the hostel is strictly demanded. Bad behaviour, lack of respect to the authorities, indiscipline, repeated late coming, interference with the privacy of others, disobedience of rules of the hostel are reasons enough for one to be dismissed from the hostel.
29. Loyalty to the hostel is expected from the students and when they are aware of any such happening affecting the prestige of the hostel or about any of the students in the hostel, they are bound to inform the warden of all the happenings for their safety and security.
30. Hostel authorities have the right to take disciplinary actions against any inmate if and when found offendable against the hostel regulations.
31. Montfort hostel is a home away from home. Students are most welcome to meet the Principal or Warden to explain individual problems or difficulties if any.

Outfits

Apart from the school uniform, the following items are to be brought:

- Two bathing towels and three sets of night suits. (No lungi allowed)
- Four sets of colour dress.
- Two pairs of black shoes.
- Two pairs of white shoes
- One pair of slippers.
- Two sports banians, one school tie, one school belt and one woolen sweater. (These items can be bought from school.)

Other Personal requirements

- Soap, soap dish, washing soap, a plastic bucket and a plastic mug.
- Comb, mirror and hair oil, tooth brush and tooth paste.
- Shoe polish and brush.
- Four good locks and a key chain (Duplicate keys are to be deposited with the warden)
- Pen, marker pen, pencil, sharpener, foot rule, eraser, mathematical instrument box and colour pencils.
- Two pillow cases, one good woolen blanket and two bed sheets.
- Three pairs of games dress and two pairs of canvas shoes for games.



GIRLS' BOARDING

Augustinian Sisters

The origin of Augustinian Sisters of Cologne, Germany dates back to 1838, when four sisters responded the call of the church and the need of their time, dedicating their lives to the humanity. True to their tradition, they try to continue Christ's Ministry through various activities such as health ministry, education, hostels, counseling, home for the senior citizens, nursing schools, social activities etc. They started their first house in India at Kumily in 1967 rendering health services and their services are available in many parts of the country. Realizing a great need of girls' boarding in Montfort School, they have initiated to run the girls' boarding.

Outfits

Apart from the school uniform, the following items are to be brought:

- Two bathing towels and three sets of night suits.
- Four sets of colour dress.
- Two pairs of black shoes.
- Two pairs of white shoes
- One pair of slippers.
- Two sports banians, one school tie, one school belt and one woolen sweater. (These items can be bought from school.)
